

# End Times: Are You Ready For The Day?

**DAY:**

Monday

**TITLE:**

Reading the Signs Around You

**KEY VERSE:**

Matthew 24:3 -- "Tell us, when will these things be? And what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?"

**REFLECTION:**

I want you to think about a road sign. It is not there to decorate the highway. It is there to warn you, to prepare you, to keep you from being caught off guard. When I look at the world around me right now, I see God's signposts everywhere. The persecution of believers is at a level history has never quite seen before. Deception is spreading through churches that once stood firm. Violence and moral confusion are rising on every side. God is not hiding these things from us. He is showing them to us because He loves us. He wants us awake, not anxious. He wants us prepared, not paralyzed. I am not here to frighten you this week. I am here to stir you. When you see these signs, lift your eyes. Your God is not surprised by any of it.

**PRAYER:**

Lord, open my eyes to the times I am living in. Give me a heart that is alert without being afraid, and anchored in Your truth. Thank You that You are never caught off guard.

**DAILY ACTION:**

Take five minutes today to read Matthew 24:3-14 slowly and write down one sign that stands out to you personally.

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**DAY:**

Tuesday

**TITLE:**

Calling Things What God Calls Them

**KEY VERSE:**

Isaiah 5:20 -- "Woe to those who call evil good, and good evil; who put darkness for light, and light for darkness; who put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter."

**REFLECTION:**

One of the clearest signs that we are living in the last days is this: the world has completely flipped the labels. What God calls righteous, the culture calls hateful. What God calls sin, the world now celebrates and protects. I have watched this shift happen with my own eyes in just a few decades, and it is accelerating. Isaiah wrote these words thousands of years ago, and yet they describe our headlines today with frightening accuracy. I want to be honest with you. It takes courage to hold to God's Word when the crowd is screaming in the other direction. But I also want to remind you that we are not called to be popular. We are called to be faithful. Jesus did not waver when the culture pressed Him. He stayed anchored to the Father's heart, and so

must we. Do not let the noise of this world rename what God has already named.

**PRAYER:**

Father, give me the courage to call things what You call them, even when it costs me something. Keep my heart soft toward people and firm toward truth. I trust Your Word over every voice around me.

**DAILY ACTION:**

Identify one area of your life or thinking where cultural pressure has quietly begun to reshape how you see something God addresses clearly in Scripture, and bring it honestly before God today.

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**DAY:**

Wednesday

**TITLE:**

The Blessed Hope That Anchors Us

**KEY VERSE:**

Titus 2:13 -- "Looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ."

**REFLECTION:**

I love this verse because of the word blessed. Not dreaded. Not uncertain. Blessed. The return of Jesus is meant to be the greatest source of hope you carry through your week. I think about what it means that in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, everything changes. No more pain. No more grief. No more fighting the same battles year after year. I am not preaching this to make you passive or to get you to check out of your responsibilities today. I am preaching it because I want you to feel the weight of genuine hope. The disciples had it. Paul had it. It changed how they lived, how they loved, and how they sacrificed. When you know where the story ends, you stop living in fear of the middle chapters. Fix your eyes on this hope today. It is not a distant fantasy. It is a promise from a God who keeps every single one.

**PRAYER:**

Jesus, I thank You that Your return is not a rumor but a certainty. Let the hope of Your coming shape how I live today, how I treat people, and how I handle what is hard. Come quickly, Lord.

**DAILY ACTION:**

Write Titus 2:13 on a card or sticky note and place it somewhere you will see it throughout the day as a reminder of the hope you carry.

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**DAY:**

Thursday

**TITLE:**

As in the Days of Noah

**KEY VERSE:**

Matthew 24:37 -- "But as the days of Noah were, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be."

**REFLECTION:**

When I read about Noah's generation, I do not just see ancient history. I see a mirror. The Bible says the

earth was filled with violence, that every intent of the human heart was only evil continually, and that there was deep moral corruption on every side. Noah kept preaching for a hundred years while people laughed at him and went on with their lives as if nothing was coming. Then the first raindrop fell. I think about that moment often. They had never seen rain before. Imagine the terror when the sky opened and they finally understood that Noah had been telling the truth all along. Today is not a day for us to be smug. Today is a day for urgency. Jesus is our ark. He is the only way through what is coming. Are you in Him? Are the people you love in Him? That question should drive how you spend your time and your words this week.

**PRAYER:**

Lord, give me the urgency of Noah without the pride that comes with thinking I have it all figured out. Let me point people to Jesus as the only refuge, and let me do it with love and with boldness. Help me not waste today.

**DAILY ACTION:**

Think of one person in your life who does not know Jesus. Say a specific prayer for them by name today, and ask God to show you one natural way to share His love with them this week.

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**DAY:**

Friday

**TITLE:**

Are You Ready for That Day?

**KEY VERSE:**

Luke 21:36 -- "Watch therefore, and pray always that you may be counted worthy to escape all these things that will come to pass, and to stand before the Son of Man."

**REFLECTION:**

I want to close this week with the most important question I know how to ask. Are you ready? Not are you religious. Not are you a good person. Not do you attend church. Are you ready? I am not asking to frighten you. I am asking because I love you and I do not want anyone left behind. A consecrated life is not about being perfect. It is about being surrendered. It is about walking closely enough with Jesus that when He appears, nothing between you and Him needs to be settled in that final moment. The good news is that today is still the day of salvation. If something in your heart is unsettled, do not ignore that. That is the Holy Spirit doing exactly what He does best. Draw near to God today. Get right. Stay ready. Because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect, and the greatest thing I could ever say to you is this: make sure you are going with Him.

**PRAYER:**

Father, I want to be ready. Search my heart today and show me anything that is standing between me and full surrender to You. I choose You above everything else. Come, Lord Jesus.

**DAILY ACTION:**

Spend ten quiet minutes today in honest conversation with God, asking Him specifically if there is any area of your life where you have been holding back from full surrender, and listen for His answer.
