DAY:

Monday

TITLE:

You Were Made to Speak

KEY VERSE:

1 Corinthians 14:1 -- "Pursue love and desire spiritual gifts, but especially that you may prophesy."

REFLECTION:

I want you to hear something straight from my heart this morning -- God never intended the gifts of the Spirit to belong only to pastors or Bible school students. He gave them to you. Every single one of you. When I read 1 Corinthians 12:7, it stops me every time: "the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all." Each one. That's not a suggestion -- that's a declaration. You carry something inside you that your brother or sister desperately needs to hear. A word of encouragement. A prophetic stirring. Something bubbling up from the Holy Ghost that could change someone's entire day, maybe their entire life. Don't sit on it. Don't wait until you feel qualified. Desire the gifts. Ask God for them. Say it out loud today: I shall operate in the gifts of the Spirit. Because friend, it's time to open your mouth.

PRAYER:

Lord, forgive me for thinking the gifts were for everyone but me. Today I'm asking You to stir up what You've already placed inside me. I desire to be used by You -- for Your glory and for the good of the people around me.

DAILY ACTION:

Write down one spiritual gift you feel stirring in you, and spend five minutes asking God specifically to develop it in your life.

DAY:

Tuesday

TITLE:

A Clean Vessel Carries a Pure Word

KEY VERSE:

2 Timothy 2:21 -- "Therefore if anyone cleanses himself from the latter, he will be a vessel for honor, sanctified and useful for the Master, prepared for every good work."

REFLECTION:

I've said it in our church and I'll say it again here -- the cleaner the vessel, the purer the gift. This isn't about being perfect. None of us are. But there's a real connection between the purity of our lives and the clarity of what flows through us. When someone gives a prophetic word that feels off -- squirrely, heavy, bringing bondage instead of life -- I promise you, something isn't right in the vessel. That's not judgment, that's just how the Spirit works. He flows cleanly through a clean pipe. So what do we do? We stay in the Word. We pray in the Holy Ghost. When we mess up, we fess up and make it right with God. We don't try to live a

double life. Because you are not just living for yourself -- you are a carrier of something heaven wants to deliver to earth. Keep yourself ready.

PRAYER:

Father, I want to be a vessel of honor. Show me anything in my life that's blocking Your flow, and give me the courage to deal with it honestly. I want what comes through me to be pure -- because the people around me deserve the real thing.

DAILY ACTION:

Take five quiet minutes today to ask the Holy Spirit to highlight one area of your life where you need to clean house -- then take one practical step toward doing it.

DAY:

Wednesday

TITLE:

Pray in the Spirit More Than You Think You Need To

KEY VERSE:

1 Corinthians 14:18 -- "I thank my God I speak with tongues more than you all."

REFLECTION:

Paul didn't whisper that verse -- he declared it. He prayed in the Spirit constantly, and I believe it was the engine behind everything else he carried. I love praying in the Holy Ghost. When I spend extended time praying in the Spirit, something shifts. My spiritual antenna gets sharper. The gifts begin to flow with more clarity and strength. That's not coincidence -- that's connection. Praying in tongues builds you up from the inside out. It bypasses your limited understanding and lets the Spirit of God pray the perfect will of God through you. And here's what I want you to catch from 1 Corinthians 14:13 -- Paul says if you pray in tongues, pray that you may also interpret. That means interpretation is available to you. You can ask for it. So don't just rush through your prayer time. Slow down. Linger in the Spirit. Let it build. Let it flow. The gifts grow from this place.

PRAYER:

Holy Spirit, I want to pray like Paul prayed -- often, deeply, and with great faith. Teach me to linger in Your presence and to trust that what I'm building in private will overflow into something powerful in public.

DAILY ACTION:

Set a timer for ten minutes today and pray only in the Spirit -- no agenda, no shopping list. Just give your voice to the Holy Ghost and trust Him with it.

DAY:

Thursday

TITLE:

Let It Bubble Up

KEY VERSE:

1 Corinthians 14:3 -- "But he who prophesies speaks edification and exhortation and comfort to men."

REFLECTION:

I described prophecy in our service as something that bubbles up or tumbles out of your spirit -- and I want you to sit with that image today. It's not manufactured. It's not forced. It starts as a stirring. Maybe a phrase you can't shake. A picture. A subject that keeps burning in you and won't go away. That's the Spirit wanting to speak through you to someone who needs exactly what you're carrying. The simple gift of prophecy isn't about predicting the future or being spectacular. It's about edification -- building people up. Exhortation -- stirring them toward what God's called them to. Comfort -- letting them know they are not alone. Start at home. Practice with God in your private time. Give a word in your small group. Let people weigh it. Be willing to grow. Because I'll tell you what -- the body of Christ desperately needs people who will open their mouths and let God speak life into one another.

PRAYER:

Lord, let me be someone who builds people up. Give me the courage to speak when I sense that stirring inside me, and the humility to grow when I get it wrong. I want to be used to comfort, strengthen, and lift the people around me.

DAILY ACTION:

In a conversation today -- with a friend, family member, or small group -- share one encouraging word you feel the Spirit has put on your heart for that person.

DAY:

Friday

TITLE:

Don't Let Your Word Die

KEY VERSE:

Ephesians 4:11 -- "And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers."

REFLECTION:

I think about the prophetic word Larry Huggins spoke over me as a young man. Every decade or so I listen to it again -- and I'm living it out. Every piece of it. But here's what Paul told Timothy that I never want you to forget: stir up the gift of God that was given to you by prophecy. If you don't keep a prophetic word alive -- if you don't tend to it, pray over it, stand on it -- it can wither. The calling and the anointing that go with it can lose their edge. When God speaks a word over your life that bears witness in your spirit, don't cheapen it. Write it down. Revisit it. Let it fuel your faith on hard days. And don't let other people's imperfect attempts at the gifts cause you to despise prophecy altogether. Some people miss it -- and that's okay. We're all growing. But don't throw out the gift because someone got it wrong. God is still speaking. And He's still speaking through you.

PRAYER:

Father, thank You for every word You've spoken over my life. Help me to steward those words faithfully and to keep the flame burning -- especially when circumstances tell me to give up. I believe You finish what You start.

DAILY ACTION:

Find a prophetic word, scripture, or promise God has given you -- write it on a notecard and place it somewhere visible as a daily reminder to keep standing on it.
